Furthermore, Cefic's latest sustainability report and charter would be published in October 2017 during its Chemical Convention. Finally, national good practices were presented by ECEG members Jyrki Hollmén from Finnish Kemianteollisuus, Eric Firtion, expert on plant-based chemistry from French UIC, and German social partners Gertraud Lauber, IGBCE, and Andreas Ogrinz, BAVC, on Chemie3.

The workshop was preceded by ECEG's Steering Committee meeting: members discussed ECEG's internal affairs, governance, and latest developments in EU social policy and SSDC.
